



Message From The Pastor's Desk

THE JOY OF THE LORD



In the first reading of this 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C, Nehemiah told the people, "Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the LORD must be your strength!" because "This day is holy to

our Lord" (Nehemiah 8:9-10). Yes, every day, every hour, every minute, every second of our lives is holy to our God and so we must rejoice in the Lord.

Sad to say, many a time, we tend to separate joy and gladness from holiness, religion, and church, and often, think of religion the way we think of healthy food—it may not taste good, but it is good for you, so endure it. Joy and gladness are more likely associated with an evening at the local pub than with a morning in the church. But Scripture says, "In the presence of God is the fullness of joy; at His right hand, happiness forever".

Nehemiah's words of encouragement came because the people were weeping and crying in repentance for their sins, after hearing the Word of God read to them by Ezra and the Scribes. So, Nehemiah urged them not to mourn or weep, but rather to enjoy and to rejoice for "The joy of the Lord must be their strength".

Joy, here, is not the joy that comes from being naturally disposed to be bouncy "Tigers", nor is it the joy that comes from experiencing happy circumstances, e.g. winning the lottery, getting a promotion, etc. Rather, the Joy of the Lord comes from a settled conviction that God is in charge of my life, that He is faithful to His promises, and that He cares about me, no matter what. Habakkuk expressed this kind of joy when he wrote, "Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food, though there are no sheep in the pen and no cattle in the stalls, yet I

will rejoice in the Lord, I will be joyful in God my Savior. The Sovereign Lord is my strength" (3:17-19)

So, the joy of the Lord comes from knowing that no matter what comes my way - be it personal or family hardship, the routine ups and downs of life, a failing health or weaning finances, that I have, through it all, a God whose strength is overwhelmingly limitless. It is the joy that comes from knowing that God is more than able to provide me with everything I need, if only I can trust and believe in Him and believing that God's grace and strength is sufficient for me in everything. Nehemiah encouraged the people to remember that the power of God is greater than those that threatened them, and, as the apostle Paul puts it, God is greater than what we can offer. So, the joy of the Lord come from knowing and trusting that God's power is stronger than that which can come against me, from recognizing that God is with me in all things, from appreciating the righteousness that God has conferred on me in Christ Jesus and the pledge of His covenantal love for me, for all eternity, from being able to be part of what builds up the body of Christ by devoting my time to communal worship, bible study, and encouraging and sharing godly fellowship with others.

Rejoicing in the Lord is a lifestyle! It gives us the strength to face life's challenges by helping us focus on God instead of our fears. It allows us to put God first in our lives, to be immersed in the things of God, and to love God above all things. The joy of the Lord is the beginning of our peace with the world. Let us go ahead and infect ourselves with the joy of the Lord and we will see our lives change for the better.

ST. MICHAEL'S COLLECTIONS

Below is an explanation of some of the different St. **Michael's Collections:**

S.O.S. Collection - This is a monthly "restricted" collection dedicated to paying our utility bills. Restricted collections are not assessed by the Archdiocese of Newark and therefore all funds are used solely by St. Michael's to pay our bills. S.O.S. collections are appreciated at all times.

<u>Tithing</u> - This is a monthly "restricted" collection dedicated to paying for the new the upkeep of the Church boiler and airconditioner. Restricted collections are not assessed by the Archdiocese and therefore all funds are used solely for St. Michael's needs. Tithing collections are appreciated at all times.

Assessment Collection - The Archdiocese of Newark assesses all parishes in the Archdiocese, and a percentage of the parish's annual unrestricted revenue, is paid monthly. This assessment is used by the Archdiocese to support administrative services. St. Michael's has instituted a monthly "restricted" collection that is used solely for paying our monthly assessment.

All Assessment Collection funds are sent directly to Archdiocese of Newark, monthly, to pay our Assessment Obligation. No funds are used for St. Michael's needs.

<u>National Collections</u> - the Archdiocese of Newark has ten collections during the year to benefit various organizations such as the retired priest's fund, the church in Eastern Europe, the religious retirement fund, and mission appeals. Money from the national collections go directly to the Archdiocese of Newark.

St. Vincent De Paul Collection - money donated to St. Vincent De Paul is distributed prior to Thanksgiving and prior to Easter to local foodbanks, soup kitchens and social centers that provide food and shelter for those in need.
