



Message From The Pastor's Desk

The Lord is My Shepherd



On this 28th Sunday in Ordinary Times, Year A, my attention is drawn to the Responsorial Psalm, which is taken from Psalm 23, a psalm that states that

adversities in this life should not shake us because we worship a God who is the Lord of deliverance; a God who can save, no matter how desperate the situation may be or how bad things are.

This Psalm states that the Lord is my shepherd—as my shepherd, the responsibility of my safety and my wellbeing is in His hands—and therefore, that there is nothing I shall want, for fresh and green are the pastures where He gives me repose, and that near restful waters—a place with a calming effect, a place of meditative disposition, a place for an encounter with Him—He leads me to give rest to my wandering spirit.

The Psalmist states that when it comes to everyday struggles in life, the good Lord will provide me "with guidance for the sake of His name."-notice that this is not for my sake but for His own namesake. So, it does not depend on my condition or righteousness, and because God's saving power in my life is for the sake of His Name, then, "Even if I walk in the valley of darkness"—those moments when trouble abounds everywhere, and there doesn't seem to be any light in sight.; those moments when I am worn out and weary, and my life looks like it is being overrun by negativities, trials, and tribulations; those when sickness moments strikes. and

treatment and therapy do not seem to be doing much or even make things worse; those moments when friends pull back because the situation and reliance on others, for care and help, begin to dissipate, leading to feelings of loneliness. discouragement, despondency, alienation, and abandonment; those moments when the shame of past sins burden the heart with regrets and life-problems are mistaken for divine punishment; those moments when no one seems to understand and the strength to go on, to pray, or even to trust in God, becomes overrun my cynicism—"No evil will I fear because He [God] is there, at my side, with His rod and His staff to give me courage. For these reasons, the Psalmist concludes, "Only goodness and kindness shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD for years to come." Let us say "Amen" to that!

My friends let us add this psalm to our daily prayer routine. May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our hearts so that we may know the hope that belongs to us as His children! May our good and merciful God fully supply whatever you need in accordance with His glorious riches in Christ Jesus! To our God and Father, to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and to the Holy Spirit be glory forever and ever. Amen.

The Archdiocese identified that struggles with mental health come with personal struggles in faith and even disengagement from the Church. With this in mind, we have changed our name to Mind and Spirit Ministry, which aligns better with our goals of support for the Parish.

Our goal is to support the mind and spirit of parishioners from all ages and backgrounds who may have their spiritual health impacted by difficulties experienced in their daily life.

We've previously introduced "Blue Christmas" and our next step in support of parishioners is through spiritual support groups. These groups will be held for parishioners in attendance to share, reflect and pray together. We will also share a prayer in the bulletin each month dedicated to individual themes of mental health to remind us and those in need of God's grace and love.

What do you need know to be a part of this worthwhile ministry?

- You need to have a washing machine and iron (no starch please).
- Based on the size of our team you can expect to be asked every 3 to 4 months to launder the clothes.
- The linens are washed and pressed. The linens are usually picked up on the weekend and returned within the week of pickup.
- A typical wash consists of approximately 50 to 75 altar clothes.
