



Message From The Pastor's Desk

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT



This past Thursday, we celebrated Thanksgiving Day. Amazingly, when President George Washington recommended and assigned Thursday the 26th of November, in 1789

as Thanksgiving Day, and when President Abraham Lincoln declared the final Thursday of November as a national Thanksgiving Day, in 1863, both presidents saw the act of thanksgiving as not just limited to giving thanks but also as a time to seek God's forgiveness for our communal sins, and a call to the responsibility of creating a peaceful, more just and equitable world. This is very interesting because both presidents saw thanking God for our blessings as intrinsically tied into reconciliation with God and to the greater responsibility of being benefactors to a world in great need of our kindness, goodness and mercy. Amazingly, this is exactly what Advent is all about.

This Sunday is the first Sunday of Advent and the beginning of a new liturgical year, (Year C). While many a time, we look at the Advent season as a time we prepare for the celebration of Christmas-the birth of Christ, in the true sense, it is really the season when we are invited to be mindful of the second coming of Christ; a time to remember that we will be accountable to God for how we have lived our lives. It is a time that calls us to seek reconciliation with God, self, and others; a time that calls us to forgive and be forgiven. It is a time to let go of past failures, negativities, hate, anger, wrath, vengeful spirit, and guilt. It is a time to let go, let God, and get going. It is a time to embrace the freedom of living life as a child of God with the fullest confidence found in the saving grace of His Son, Jesus Christ.

In line with the second coming of Christ, Advent is also a time that calls us to be much

more conscious of reaching out to suffering humanity. Scripture says that accountability, on the last day, will center around what we did to be the compassionate hand and heart of God to those in need. Therefore, as we go into Advent this year, let us remember, pray, and commit ourselves to caring for the hungry and destitute among us. Let us remember and pray for those who are alone and forgotten and commit ourselves to doing something about it. Let us remember and pray for those silenced by the weight of oppression, and injustice and violence, commit ourselves to do all in our power to pursue justice, fairness, and equity for all. Let initiate, daily, little, compassionate, us graceful, unexpected and undeserved acts of love towards others.

Advent, my friends, is a time to choose to live life from a place of peace, happiness, and joy. So, let us be kind and graceful to ourselves for we deserve to be joyful and happy. let us do what we must to make sure that emotions like anger, hatred, envy, hopelessness, failure, and frustration do not become default emotions in our lives, as we look forward to celebrating the birth of our Savior and prepare for His second coming.

ST. MICHAEL'S COLLECTIONS

Below is an explanation of some of the different St. Michael's Collections:

S.O.S. Collection - This is a monthly "restricted" collection dedicated to paying our utility bills. Restricted collections are not assessed by the Archdiocese of Newark and therefore all funds are used solely by St. Michael's to pay our bills. S.O.S. collections are appreciated at all times.

<u>Tithing</u> - This is a monthly "restricted" collection dedicated to paying for the new the upkeep of the Church boiler and airconditioner. *Restricted collections are not assessed by the Archdiocese and therefore all funds are used solely for St. Michael's needs.* Tithing collections are appreciated at all times

Assessment Collection - The Archdiocese of Newark assesses all parishes in the Archdiocese, and a percentage of the parish's annual unrestricted revenue, is paid monthly. This assessment is used by the Archdiocese to support administrative services. St. Michael's has instituted a monthly "restricted" collection that is used solely for paying our monthly assessment.

All Assessment Collection funds are sent directly to Archdiocese of Newark, monthly, to pay our Assessment Obligation. No funds are used for St. Michael's needs.

National Collections - the Archdiocese of Newark has ten collections during the year to benefit various organizations such as the retired priest's fund, the church in Eastern Europe, the religious retirement fund, and mission appeals. Money from the national collections go directly to the Archdiocese of Newark.

St. Vincent De Paul Collection – money donated to St. Vincent De Paul is distributed prior to Thanksgiving and prior to Easter to local foodbanks, soup kitchens and social centers that provide food and shelter for those in need.
