

## Message From The Pastor's Desk

### **Live Your Life**



There is the story of a pastor who prayed at the Boston stadium. After he was done, one of the commentators

said, "I believe this is the greatest prayer ever said to the Boston crowd". I guess that pastor must have prayed for performance, not for grace.

The need to make a good impression on others, to be noticed, to be recognized, or to be appreciated is deeply wired into our core selves. So, it is not uncommon to find ourselves living out our lives to please others, impress others, or, as today's gospel puts it, "Done for men to see." The problem, though, is that this can be very dangerous as we can easily live under the constant burden of curetting to external pressure while denying our unique selves—failing to embrace our individuality. This be can verv emotionally and physically draining, and it is impossible to be authentic if we are constantly trying to impress others and building a life that isn't true to the self. Life should be lived, not performing for popularity but for purpose. We don't live for others' approval; we live for God's purpose.

There is nothing as rewarding as being

honest with oneself. It makes it easier to focus one's energy on what makes one truly happy, things that bring joy and fulfillment into one's life. It makes it easier, to be honest with ourselves and those around us. It makes it easier to express one's true thoughts and feelings without worrying about how others react. helps It create deeper relationships with others and enables a greater sense of self-awareness. It makes it easier to make decisions that are true to the self, disposing one to be more willing to take risks without fear of judgment or disapproval.

My friends, the people we try so hard to impress, may not even be paying attention because they are also busy trying to impress others. So, we should focus on who we are and how to grow into the best version of ourselves. Doing things to impress others makes us more aware of our imperfections and makes us focus on what we don't have and on what others want us to be. If our goal is to impress, we will always find ourselves living the life of a performer.

Confirmation is typically received in Grade 9 after completing the Religious Education program. Missed years of Religious Education will require make-up assignments and assessment of readiness which may delay the reception of the sacrament in Grade 9.

The Archdiocese identified that struggles with mental health come with personal struggles in faith and even disengagement from the Church. With this in mind, we have changed our name to Mind and Spirit Ministry, which aligns better with our goals of support for the Parish.

Our goal is to support the mind and spirit of parishioners from all ages and backgrounds who may have their spiritual health impacted by difficulties experienced in their daily life.

We've previously introduced "Blue Christmas" and our next step in support of parishioners is through spiritual support groups. These groups will be held for parishioners in attendance to share, reflect and pray together. We will also share a prayer in the bulletin each month dedicated to individual themes of mental health to remind us and those in need of God's grace and love.

- The linens are washed and pressed. The linens are usually picked up on the weekend and returned within the week of pickup.
- A typical wash consists of approximately 50 to 75 altar clothes.
